Signs and graphics can be designed and produced using a range of traditional and contemporary techniques, involving the use of advanced printing software and technology, and a range of methods for illumination and fabrication.

EMPLOYMENT PATHWAYS

Sign manufacturers design, manufacture, print and or paint signs for displays, buildings, hoardings, boats and structures for construction, graphic production and visual display industries.

EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES

After successfully completion of this qualification, students may have the opportunity to progress into higher level qualification

MATERIALS REQUIRED

All students must have access to a workplace that has personal protective equipment, including appropriate head attire and suitable tools of the trade.

COURSE CREDIT

Credit may be assigned for the recognition of equivalence in content and learning outcomes between different types of learning and/or qualifications.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Students must register as an apprentice with an approved Australian Apprenticeship Support Network Provider (AASN), for more information please visit the Apprenticeships Info website.

Employers must be able to meet the employer resource criteria including nominating a supervisor who holds the appropriate industry qualification(s).

Students applying to access funded places will be required to meet the eligibility requirements applicable to the funding program, this may include undertaking a Language, Literacy and Numeracy test.

DELIVERY MODELS

Apprenticeship (including School-Based) - offered in Queensland, workplace based (combination of training and assessment delivery methods, including written assessment, portfolio of evidence, logbook and practical observation), 4 years full time or 8 years part time. RPL - offered in Australia, external based (combination of assessment of written evidence, practical observation and competency conversations), duration and fees will be determined by quality of evidence submitted and amount of gap training required. 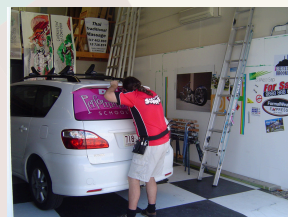

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Funding Eligibility

CAREER START

General Training Pathway - Eligibility

To access a subsidised training place under Career Start, a student must meet the following criteria:

- aged 15 years or older;
- not be a school student;
- permanently reside in Queensland;
- be an Australian citizen, or Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the right visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- not already have a certificate III or higher qualification completed within the last 10 years (qualifications completed as a school student and foundation skills qualifications do not count);
- not be enrolled in another qualification, even if it is on hold or deferred, whether funded by DTET or not (foundation skills qualifications do not count).

Apprenticeship/Traineeship Pathway

School students can only access apprenticeships and traineeships through a registered SAT. This is to ensure a school student does not use their entire apprenticeship/traineeship entitlement while at school.

To be eligible to receive government subsidised training, the apprentice or trainee must:

- have entered into a Contract (training contract) for a qualification that is funded by DTET and be registered on DTET's training database;
- if from overseas, have a visa allowing them to work in Australia; and
- not have already completed two apprenticeship/traineeship qualifications (including SATs) within the last 10 years.

CAREER BOOST

General Training Pathway - Eligibility

To access a subsidised training place under Career Boost, a student must meet the following criteria:

- aged 15 years or older;
- not be a school student;
- permanently reside in Queensland;
- be an Australian citizen, or Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the right visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- not already have a certificate IV or higher qualification (including tertiary qualification) completed within the last 10 years (qualifications completed as a school student and foundation skills qualifications do not count). Note: This eligibility requirement does not apply to individuals seeking to enrol in a skill set;
- not be enrolled in another qualification, even if it is on hold or deferred, whether funded by DTET or not (foundation skills qualifications do not count).

Apprenticeship/Traineeship Pathway

To be eligible to receive government subsidised training, the apprentice or trainee must:

- have entered into a Contract (training contract) for a qualification that is funded by DTET and be registered on DTET systems;
- if from overseas, have a visa allowing them to work in Australia; and
